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What we do?

We work as part of the Multi-Agency **GET SAFE** Partnership providing support and protection for children and young people at risk of exploitation. As part of that support, we provide the following:

- Advice and guidance when identifying risks and concerns for children and young people who may be vulnerable to or are experiencing exploitation.
- We arrange and attend Multi Agency Child Exploitation (MACE)
 meetings. We also attend Strategy Discussions when there are
 clear concerns around Child Exploitation. We attend Missing
 Intervention Meetings for children who have been missing more
 than 3 times over a 90-day period. Any case open to early help we
 will chair the Missing Intervention Meeting.
- We have developed with partners the multi-agency a Get Safe Assessment Tool for practitioners to complete when they have identified an exploitation risk for a young person. This uses the contextual safeguarding model. When completed practitioners submit the assessment tool into the partnership Get Safe Portal. We offer support and guidance to complete this process.
- Every Tuesday afternoon there is a Get Safe meeting in the MASH where the GET SAFE multi-agency team discuss the assessments that have been submitted into the Get Safe Portal. The multiagency team RAG rates each case according to the identified level of risk or vulnerability.
- For all Red and Amber rag rated children, level four needs will be identified and a referral to children's social care is required if the child is not already on a Child Protection, Child in Need or Looked After plan. The response pathway for these children will include a MACE meeting which will be arranged with the team and partners by our WCF GET SAFE team; so we can have a detailed case discussion with the workers and partners involved with the child and support the multi-agency team to develop the child's 4P MACE plan which will include support from specific GET SAFE services as appropriate.
- Our Get Safe Link workers work with children and young people who are on either the AMBER or RED Get Safe pathway and have been identified as experiencing child exploitation this may be

through disclosure or through identified risk factors and incidents that have occurred. Their role is to engage the child / young person in face-to-face direct work to help further understand their experience, gain their trust to help identify their risks and vulnerability and work with MACE plans to provide support and protection but also add to the disruption against perpetrator(s).

- For all Green rag rated children the multi-agency group will review all available diversionary services that we can engage the child and family with subject to the parent/guardian's consent and look at the early help offer in place. Some children on the Green pathway will be open to children's services and the preventative work will be part of that existing plan.
- Our missing officers complete all welfare return interviews for Worcestershire children when a child has been reported missing and then found. They will share this information with the allocated worker and the details will be recorded in the welfare return interview form in liquid logic. If there is a need for early help support, they will seek consent and make those requests for service family support as per the levels of need guidance. Our missing officers will also signpost the child and family to any additional diversionary support such as KOOTH, PACE, etc.
- We attend the weekly Missing Monday's Meeting and share information about children who are currently not in school or excluded etc and discuss how this could further increase a child's vulnerability to child exploitation and work with that team to look at actions. The missing Monday's meetings also have flagged as part of this meeting children with a Get safe flag, so this is identified in the meeting with partners.
- The multi-agency GET SAFE meeting every Tuesday in MASH also has educational representation, and the educational status of children is part of this discussion as this can increase risk and vulnerability for some children and therefore is factored into this decision making.
- We provide focused workshops to all our internal WCF staff on key areas of practice such as the National Referral Mechanism and the impact of using victim blaming language. We complete service updates at our management and leadership E2E meetings.

- We can attend team meetings across the service to support group supervision to i.e., map a specific exploitation case or to support staff on a 1:1 basis in completing NRM applications or how they can develop a 4 P plan. We offer new starters shadowing experience in our team to develop their understanding of what we offer and how they can access support from our team.
- We have attended a range of community partnership events to share information directly to young people about what GET SAFE is and to build their understanding of child exploitation and how they can seek support.
- The Team Manager and Practice Lead also attend the monthly GET SAFE operational group and contribute to the wider Worcestershire action plan against the GET SAFE strategy

What support does Climb offer?

Climb offers sports, dance, arts music and more. We work with young people who are missing school or college, starting to be reported as missing, or at risk of being drawn into criminal activity. We help young people build their resilience and so they're better able to deal with the challenges of modern childhood.

This transformative service is the first of its kind and will help children develop new skills, form real friendships and learn how to recognise people and situations that might put them at risk.

Working with schools, police, social care, activity providers and many other groups across the region, together we will build safer communities, where children can be hopeful about their futures.

THE BRANCH PROJECT – West Mercia Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Centre- WMRSASC

The Branch Project is a WMRSASC support service for children and young people under 18 years, or under 24 years for those with additional needs, who are victims and/or at risk of Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE).

The child or young person does not have to have formally reported/disclosed CSE to be supported by the Branch Project.

The Branch Project runs throughout Worcestershire, Herefordshire and Shropshire. Branch Project Workers are trained CSE support workers and accredited ISVAs (Independent Sexual Violence Advocates). They provide advocacy, education, intervention and one-to-one support to children and young people who are at risk of or have been a victim of CSE.

Support is always delivered with the consent of the young person, is tailored to their needs and wishes, and is comprised of three interlinked pathways:

Empower – psychosocial educational support interventions are delivered including those whose involvement with the Criminal Justice System (CJS) has finished or where no criminal justice process is pursued.

Cope – Where a disclosure has been made, one-to-one practical and emotional support, including advocacy, is delivered to help a child or young person throughout the Criminal Justice System. We also provide advocacy outside of the criminal justice process (Social Care, Health, Education, Employment, Housing, other voluntary agencies). **Recover** – For those who have experienced CSE, one-to-one psychosocial support interventions are delivered including those whose involvement with CJS has finished or where no CJS process is being pursued.

North Worcestershire Community Safety Partnership – RESPECT Programme

The Respect programme is a therapeutic mentoring scheme providing one to one support sessions to young people at risk of becoming victims of crime or perpetrators. Sessions are offered to children and young people who are affected by crime concerns including domestic abuse, anti-social behaviour, CSE, extremism, hate crime, bullying or engaging in challenging/risky behaviour.

West Midlands CYPSARS provides 24-hour access to specialist advice, medical care, forensic examination and holistic assessment (following assessment of urgency) for children and young people aged up to the age of 18 years following recent and non-recent sexual assault and abuse.

We also support young adults up to 25 years with complex needs.

We operate a Hub (recent) and Spoke (non-recent) service across the West Midlands region.

We deliver our service with various agencies across the region this includes 4 police force areas and 6 Integrated Care Systems (ICS)
