Welcome back! Year 6 staff are pleased to welcome the children back. We are really enthusiastic about the new term and we are looking forward to the opportunities and learning that the pupils will be experiencing during their year with us! *Mrs Jelfs & Miss Ramsden*

Reading

We will begin the year by reading books about WW2; Flossie's Secret diary, The Harmonica and A Christmas Truce. These books will engage the children and offer lots of opportunities to inspire their writing and enhance their use of vocabulary. We know that the topic of war can be upsetting but we will be looking at it in a very sensitive way and hope to inform children of an event that shaped our futures.

<u>Writing</u>

In English, we will be focusing on the style and stamina of the children's writing. They will be consolidating the skills that they have previously been taught to ensure that they produce writing that is lively and interesting. We will be taking the children on a variety of trips throughout the year to capture their imagination and inspire their writing. All children will be expected to use a full range of punctuation matched to text types in a cohesive manner.

History and Geography

Our focus this term in History and Geography is World War 2. They will explore the outbreak of war, what it would have been like for the evacuees and the roles and responsibilities that individuals had.

Art and DT

The children will be working on their sketching techniques throughout the autumn term. They will work up to creating a final piece of art work based on World War 2.

Maths

During this term, there will be a huge focus on calculation methods. We will be completing an arithmetic task daily as it is important that the children build confidence.

Our daily lessons will be split into 3 parts; try it, twist it and deepen it. This allows the children to develop their fluency skills and apply them to reasoning and problemsolving activities.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, the children will learn about the life of Stephen Hawking, Alexander Flemming and Mary Leaky. We will research scientists and inventors, create a DNA model, construct graphs and describe fossils.

<u>RE</u>

The children will think deeply about different religions. During class discussions, they will share their thoughts and feelings and reflect upon why different people live their lives differently.

For the first term back, the children will be focusing on coding; they will be looking at variables and creating inputs and outputs to design a program.
