



|  <p>Maths As mathematicians, the children will continue to use their times table knowledge to find fractions of an amount, develop their understanding of money and learn to tell the time to the nearest minute. In Year 3, we work with numbers up to 1000 so please practise counting beyond from any number in 1s, 10s and 100s. You can continue to support your child at home by practising mental addition and subtraction, division and multiplication. Don't forget to use Times Table Rockstars at home! (www.ttrockstars.com). We will continue to focus on 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 8s and 10s.</p> | <p>Reading As readers, we will be improving our ability to read fluently and begin to make inferences from a text, make comparisons within stories and improve our skills of retrieving information and facts. <i>Class Texts for the Summer Term include...</i></p>   | <p>Writing As writers, we will be focusing on improving our descriptive writing. We will be developing our skills when describing settings and developing characters. Each morning, children will write sentences about a picture so that they can focus on the basic skills of writing sentences.</p>  |
| <p>Science As scientists, we will be investigating forces. We will be particularly interested in how gravity impacts our lives and how magnets work.</p> | <p>RE As global citizens, the children will be exploring the kind of world Jesus wanted and how people try to make the world a better place.</p> | <p>Spanish As linguists, we will be exploring different sports and expressing our opinions about them to improve our vocabulary.</p> |
|  <p>History As historians, Year 3 will be continuing to find out about the significance of the Ancient Egyptian civilisation.</p> | <p>Computing As digital creators, we will be exploring different types of animation and how devices can be connected to make networks.</p>  | <p>Music As musicians, we will be exploring what jazz music is and how music is different around the world.</p>  |
| <p>Design Technology As technologists, we will design, make and evaluate a new repurposed product.</p> | <p>Geography As geographers, we will be exploring where our fruit comes from.</p>  | <p>My Life In My Life, we will be looking at different stereotypes and thinking about ourselves and what we like.</p> |
| | <p>Art As artists, we will be discovering how artists sculpt the human form and try different sculpting techniques.</p>  | <p>PE As sportspeople, we will take part in Net and Wall games followed by Striking and Fielding games.
