

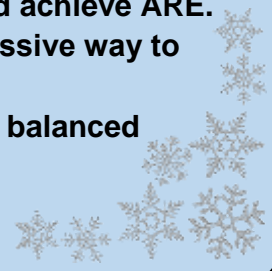


Autumn Update 2019^{20th} December 2019

- ✓ There has been opportunity for collaboration and CPD through our Subject Improvement Days. Each with a carefully planned agenda to ensure maximum impact.
- ✓ Our Accelerated Reading programme has been introduced this term and is being approached enthusiastically by the children in Years 4, 5 and 6. Celebration assemblies have taken place to share achievements.

- ✓ The NPQML and NPQSL programmes of continued professional development are being used to further develop leadership skills.

- ✓ Whole school PSHE weeks (Anti Bullying week and Road Safety week), where pupils participated in additional activities.
